

## HELPING THOSE IN NEED

- In 2016, 4,088 adult TANF recipients obtained employment
- Established high school equivalency and vocational training programs for TANF recipients
- Increased the TANF work participation rate from **36.1% to 51.3%**
- In 2016, **\$57.9 million in SNAP benefits provided to 255,591 monthly**

- Keeping healthcare costs low
- Expanded Medicaid to cover **267,000 more New Mexicans**
- The number of uninsured children has plummeted to **only 4%, down from 10% in 2011**
- **Slashed the uninsured rate by nearly 50%**

## EXPANDING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

- **More New Mexicans than ever before are getting the mental health and substance abuse services they need. A 75% increase since 2013**
- Improved from 44<sup>th</sup> in the nation to 22<sup>nd</sup> in the “State of Mental Health in America” annual rankings. New Mexico moved up in all categories: Adult, Youth, Need and Access
- Established the New Mexican Access and Crisis Line and the Peer2Peer Warm Line that together served **more than 35,000 callers in 2016**

## SUPPORTING OUR FAMILIES

- Established innovative child support amnesty period and bench warrant roundup to crackdown on parents neglecting their responsibilities to their kids
- **\$1.23 million collected and 397 arrested since 2012**
- Collected a record-setting **\$140.8 million in 2016** -- while administrative costs have decreased
- Obtained support orders for **68,119 child support cases involving 98,542 children in FY16**
